# Key Terms

- **GCSE** – General Certificate of Secondary Education – the main qualification in secondary schools in the UK.
- **Vocational qualifications** – for working life – these qualifications are predominantly coursework but do contain an examined element.
- **EBACC** – English Baccalaureate – A student who secures GCSE passes at grades 9 – 5 in English, Mathematics, two sciences, a modern foreign language and a humanity (History or Geography), will be recognised as having achieved the EBACC (a balanced curriculum). They do not receive a certificate.

**All Key Stage 4 Students will study core subjects of English, Mathematics and Science.**

- All students will be entered for the Mathematics GCSE.
- All students have already started a programme of study which will enable them to be entered for English Language GCSE and English Literature GCSE.
- All students will study Core and Additional Science GCSE.
- Triple Science is an option choice that is restricted to the top performing students in Year 9 Science as selected by Miss Markham.
- Your choices of subjects after the suite of core subjects is dependent on your pathway.

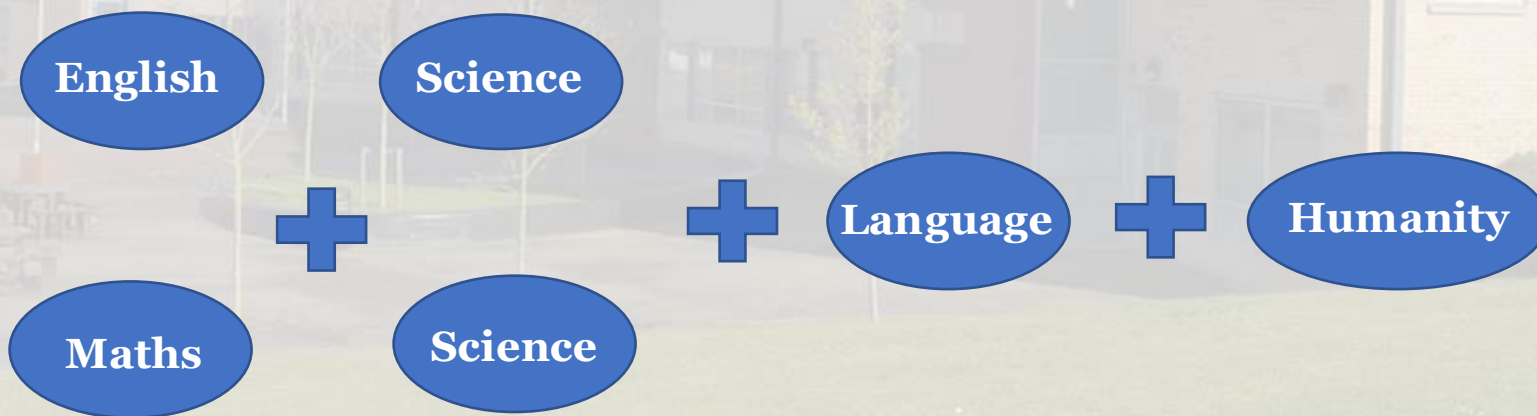
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# English Baccalaureate

- The English Baccalaureate is not a qualification in itself. Students do not receive a certificate but it is recognised as them having followed an academic balanced curriculum.
- It is recognition for students who achieve GCSE passes at grade 9 – 5 in English, Mathematics, two sciences, a modern foreign language and a humanity (History or Geography).





# Submitting Preferences

# Oversubscribed Courses

- What happens if a course is oversubscribed:
- Attendance (the higher better).
- The number of negative behaviour points accrued (the lower the better).
- Attendance at relevant enrichment clubs (for example participating in shows if interested in dance or drama).
- Current effort in chosen subjects.
- Academic performance in current subjects.
- Contribution to wider school life (charity work etc.).



# Advice for Students

## **DO:**

1. Take the decision seriously and give yourself enough time to make an informed choice.
2. Read your past assessment reports and feedback. This may help you with your option choices.
3. Ask subject teachers their thoughts: do they think the course is right for you?
4. Do your research – which courses will you need to help you achieve in the future?
5. Choose subjects that you enjoy, engage in and can do your best in.

## **DON'T:**

1. Choose subjects just because your friends have chosen them – you are not your friends and their decision may not be right for you.
2. Reject subjects because you don't like the teacher, or choose subjects because you do like the teacher – they may not teach it next year.
3. Rush and make uninformed decisions.
4. Think carefully before choosing subjects which are similar to one another – will this be a benefit or not? Will it help you to gain a variation of skills and understanding?

- Students will receive full instructions for this process.
- The options forms will be completed online. Students who miss the deadline on **Friday 27<sup>th</sup> February 2026** are less likely to get all of their first options choices.
- Confirmation of subjects allocated will be released by the end of May and parents notified.
- Students who do not receive all of their first choices, for whatever reason, will be invited to an interview and new subjects will be discussed.
- There will be no appeals process.
- Any student who has had difficulty completing the options form, or is in need of extra support and guidance will be offered it up to 3<sup>rd</sup> March. If help is not requested and no form is submitted, students may be given the subjects felt by staff to be the most appropriate for them.
